CONDITIONS OF THE SHOW

1. Entry fee 30p per entry. Children free.
2. A maximum of 2 entries per class per person.
3. Entries REGISTERED on the preceding Thursday between 7.00pm and 8.00pm at the Peace Hall or earlier to Lindsay Smith 01527 592874 (Please use the entry form.)
4. No late entries will be accepted.
5. Exhibits to be staged (BROUGHT IN) between 8.30am and 11.00am on the day of the show.
6. Exhibitors must use vases and containers provided by the Society for Section 1 – except in Classes 1, 11, 17, 20 - 22.
7. All exhibits, to be grown or produced by the exhibitor. Classes 1, & 11 to have been owned by the exhibitor for not less than six months.
8. Judges may withhold prizes if exhibits are deemed to be of insufficient merit.
9. Trophies will be held for one year only and must be returned in good and clean condition to the Show Secretary at least two weeks before the next annual show.
10. Entrants to adult classes must be 16 years old or over.
11. The judges' decisions are final.

The Show Secretary/stewards reserve the right to re-site an entry if necessary.

Date Chutney

| | |
|-----------------------------------|--------------------|
| 1 lb Stoned Dates | 1lb Sugar |
| 1 lb Onions | 2 ozs Salt |
| One teaspoonful of cayenne pepper | |
| One teaspoonful of ground ginger | |
| 1pt vinegar | 2 ozs mustard seed |
| 1 oz pickling spice | |

Put dates and onions through the mincer (or chop very finely)

Put one third of the vinegar and all other ingredients except sugar into a pan.

(Tie spices into a muslin bag)

Simmer till thick.

Add another third of the vinegar and simmer till thick.

Add remaining vinegar and warmed sugar and simmer till thick

Chutney is ready when no liquid is visible when a wooden spoon is drawn through the mixture.

Allow to cool slightly and pot into warmed jars.

Note:- Chutney needs to 'mature' slightly before it is presented, ideally for between 1 and 3 months

Walnut Savoury Biscuits

| | |

| 175g(6 oz) plain flour | 75g (3 oz) Cheddar cheese - grated |
| 75g(3 oz) margarine | 50g (2 oz) rolled oats |
| 50g (2 oz) chopped walnuts | 1 egg |
| Half teaspoon salt | Half teaspoon dry mustard |
| Pinch pepper | 150ml (quarter pint) cold water |

Preheat oven to 190C/375F/Gas 5

Sieve together the dry ingredients, add the oats and rub in the margarine.

Stir in the grated cheese and walnuts – saving a few for the topping.

Beat the egg and reserve a teaspoonful for the glaze.

Add the egg and bind it to a stiff dough with the water.

Roll out the dough and trim it to make a rectangle. Add a pinch of salt to the remaining egg and brush this over the surface.

Sprinkle the top with a few chopped nuts. Cut it into shapes and bake for 12-15 minutes.
